Apologetics Corner

Defending our Faith with the Truth By Father Dennis M. Gordon, FSSP

Moses, the Author

<u>Ouestion</u>: "Tradition has it that **Moses wrote the** Jews knew that Moses wrote Deuteronomy. first five books of the Bible (the Pentateuch, comprised of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy). How do we know that this is true?"

Answer: "We know that Moses wrote the first five books **wrote** of me. But if you do not believe **his writings**, how of the Bible from the words of Our Lord, the affirmation of other books in the Bible, the constant tradition of the Jews, and from declarations of the Church.

"The Mosaic authorship of <u>Genesis</u> is understood by the written by Moses: 'Helcias the priest found the book of words of Our Lord in **John 7:22-23**. Before we get to that verse, recall that the law of circumcision came from Genesis 17:12. Now in John 7:22-23 we read, 'Therefore, Moses gave you circumcision (not because it is of Moses, but of the fathers;) and on the sabbath day you circumcise a man. If a man receive circumcision on the sabbath day, that **the law of Moses** may not be broken; are you angry at me because I have healed the whole man on the sabbath day?' Circumcision is the law of Moses because that law was recorded in the book Moses wrote; to the texts after the death of Moses by an inspired author. Genesis.

"As for the book of Exodus, we have the statement that God commanded Moses to write the events of the Exodus, in Exodus 17:14, 'And the Lord said to Moses: Write this for a memorial **in a book**, and deliver it to the ears of Josue.' Plus, we have His words in Mark 12:26, 'And as concerning the dead that they rise again, have you not read in the book of Moses, how in the bush God spoke to him, saying: I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob?' This references an event from Exodus, showing that Our Lord knew Moses wrote that book.

"Regarding Leviticus, in Romans 10:5 St Paul said, 'For *Moses wrote*, that the justice which is of the law, the man that shall do it, shall live by it.' This is a reference to Leviticus 18:5, showing that Leviticus was yet another of the books of the Pentateuch that Moses wrote.

"Regarding the Mosaic authorship of the book of Numbers, we find these words in Sacred Scripture: 'These are the mansions (journeys) of the children of Israel, who went out of Egypt by their troops under the conduct of Moses and Aaron, which Moses wrote down according to the places of their encamping, which they changed by the commandment of the Lord.' (Numbers 33:1-2), showing he wrote Numbers.

"We know that the Jews believed Moses wrote Deuteronomy by these words from a man in Luke 20:28; 'Master, Moses wrote unto us, If any man's brother die, having a wife, and he leave no children, that his brother should take her to wife, and raise up seed unto his brother.' This reference is to Deuteronomy 25:5, so it is clear that the

"Our Lord also said in John 5:46-47, implying Moses" authorship of the Jewish Scriptures - 'If you did believe Moses, you would perhaps believe me also; for he will you believe my words?'

"Finally, **<u>2 Paralipomenon 34:14</u>** shows that the five books (known collectively as the book of the Law) were the law of the Lord, by the hand of Moses.

"All the Israelites and all the rabbis always held that Moses wrote the first five books of the Bible, the Pentateuch, and the Catholic Church affirms this also.

"A June 27, 1906 decree of the Pontifical Biblical Commission (which at that time held a position of magisterial authoritative - teaching authority in the Church) affirmed that some minor clarifying additions may have been made Still, it affirmed that Moses was the author of the Pentateuch, affirming also that he may have used scribes to compose the work, to whom he gave his thoughts, and whose work he approved as its principal and inspired author."
