Defending our Faith with the Truth By Father Dennis M. Gordon, FSSP

Why Catholics Kneel

UESTION: "Why is it that sometimes Catholics kneel when they pray?"

NSWER: "Many reasons, but among them is that we are following the example of the Apostles as we know from the Bible.

"At Ephesus, St. Paul knelt to pray: 'Kneeling

down, he prayed with them all' (*Acts 20:36*), and all who were with him did the same also (**'we** kneeled down on the shore: and we prayed,' *Acts 21:5*).

"St. Peter also did this, when he prayed before raising the girl Tabitha back to life, in the city of Joppe: 'Peter, kneeling down, prayed' (*Acts 9:40*).

"By the way, the prophets in the Old Testament sometimes knelt to pray also—like the prophet Micheas did: 'What shall I offer to the Lord that is worthy? Wherewith shall I **kneel** before the high God?' (*Micheas (Michah*) 6:6). The prophet's words hint as to why the apostles and prophets would sometimes kneel to pray: because kneeling down is an external sign of something inside; the humble acknowledgement that we are aware that we are below the high God.

This humility is especially important when we are receiving a special grace from God, or asking

"And He was withdrawn away from them a stone's cast, and kneeling down, He prayed." for a special grace; to show God that we appreciate it and are not worthy of the gift which He is lovingly giving us. "At the consecration of the Temple, Solomon also

knelt to offer his prayer to God (*2 Paralipome-non (Chronicles*) 6:13).

"**Did Jesus Himself do this?** Let's look at what He did in the Garden of Gethsemane: 'And He was withdrawn away from them a stone's cast, and **kneeling** down, He prayed'" (*Luke 22:41*).
