# APOLOGETICS CORNER

*Defending our Faith with the Truth*

## Finding the Mass in the Old Testament

**Q**uestion: “I see some of the actions that the priest does during Holy Mass, and I don’t understand some of them. Can you explain some of the **motions the priest does with his hands during Mass?**”

**A**nswer: “Yes, of course! Each action he does has a symbolic meaning.

“When the priest lifts up the chalice or the Host in his hands, for example, he is offering it to God. This is an ancient action that we find beginning in the Old Testament. In **Leviticus 8:27**, when offering sacrifices, the high priest Aaron did this; *‘having lifted them up before the Lord.’* offered them to God, burning them (a *holocaust*) on the altar. Other types of sacrifices were consumed by the priests, and these, too were lifted up before they were consumed (like the priest does when he says *Ecce Agnus Dei...* ‘Behold the Lamb of God...’) We see an example of this in **Leviticus 8:29**, *‘And he took of the ram of consecration, the breast for his portion, elevating it before the Lord, as the Lord had commanded him.’*

“When the priest hold his hands over the offerings (the bread and wine, before they are consecrated into the Body and Blood of Our Lord), he is also following an ancient Judeo-Christian custom. The offering of a goat was sacrificed for the sins of the people on the annual feast known as the Day of Atonement (this is where we get the term ‘scape goat’). The idea is that they would sacrifice something—something valuable—that would die in place of the people for their sins, foreshadowing the precious offering of Our Lord on the Cross,

Who would die in place of us for our sins. Before the animal was offered, the priest would do the following:

*‘putting both hands on his [the sacrificial victim’s] head, let him confess all the iniquities of the children of Israel, and all their offences and sins... praying that they may light on his head...’ (Leviticus 16:21)*

“This is similar to what was done at the consecration of Aaron and his sons as priests. In **Leviticus 8:22** we read, *‘He offered also the second ram, in the consecration of priests: and Aaron, and his sons put their hands upon the head thereof.’* This very same action is done at a Catholic priest’s *traditional rite* of

ordination: the bishop, and after him every priest present, will lay his hands on the head of the man being ordained a priest, just as Aaron, and after him his sons, laid their hands upon the head of the ram that was being offered, during the consecration ceremony when they themselves became priests. This is still done as a part of the ancient *traditional rite of ordination* of a Catholic priest.

“This was also done when priests were consecrated in the New Testament, as we see from **1 Timothy 4:14**, *‘Neglect not the grace that is in thee: which was given thee... with imposition of the hands of the priesthood.’* This verse shows three things:

“(1) that a *priesthood* was conferred by personal appointment in the New Covenant,

“(2) that *grace* was given by being made a priest, and

“(3) that the *laying on of hands* is how the priesthood is conferred in the New Covenant.
