# Why a Crucifix?

**Question**: "Crucifixes! I see crucifixes in every Catholic home I visit! Don't you think seeing a crucifix might take people away from their 'safe zones'...? Why not just the Cross...? Why do Catholics display crucifixes?"

**Answer**: "I thought you believed in the Bible...? Do you trust St. Paul and the early Christians? If you *do*, then why don't *you* have crucifixes?!

"In <u>1 Corinthians 2:2</u> St. Paul said, 'I decided to know nothing among you, except Jesus Christ and Him crucified.' St Paul himself thought it best to only preach Christ crucified. He repeated that one chapter earlier, anticipating that people would not understand why a God who would be crucified for His creatures would be difficult to understand when he said, 'We preach Christ <u>crucified</u>: unto the Jews indeed a stumbling block, and unto the Gentiles foolishness.' (<u>1 Corinthians 1:23</u>)

"St. Paul took it further! And in doing so he explains why the crucifix (Christ crucified) is so important when he said, 'God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ: by whom the world is crucified to me, and I to the world.' (Galatians 6:14)

"And it is not just about the *cross itself*, for St. Paul says elsewhere it is about the *mortification* of *Jesus*—in other words, it is important that there is a Person on that cross. For he says in <u>2 Corinthi-</u> <u>ans 4:10</u>, Christians are 'always bearing about in our body the <u>mortification of Jesus</u>, that the life also of Jesus may be made manifest in our bodies.' Mortification means putting to death; and in Jesus' case, that meant the crucifixion. The crucifix is a way of 'bearing about the mortification of Jesus' in our bodies—that is, in our very *eyes!*  "And that Christ crucified was set forth before people's very eyes, St. Paul even said to the Christian Galatians 'before whose <u>eyes</u> Jesus Christ has been set forth <u>crucified</u>' (Galatians 3:1). I'm not saying that he was speaking specifically about crucifixes here, but the principle holds true: if <u>St.</u> <u>Paul</u> set forth 'Christ crucified' before the very eyes of the early Christians, then why can't we set forth a reminder of Christ crucified before our very eyes?

"Now, of course, we know that Jesus Christ is not still crucified; we know He rose from the dead and is reigning in heaven, but preaching Christ crucified, as St. Paul did, gives us hope today in the midst of our crosses, and is a daily reminder that Someone has die for our sins!!!"
