The Bible Records the Established **Hierarchy of the Church**

and pastors, but where do you Catholics **3:8**) come up with the idea of **a distinction** between bishops, priests and deacons? Aren't you just creating a hierarchy from these terms out of thin air to justify some governing system that you came up with?"

hierarchical functions "bishops", "priests" and "deacons"...you got it; established during St. Paul's time. it's *from the Bible!!!* Let's look in one book of the Bible (one letter of St. Paul) to show that the inspired author of this book makes this *distinc*tion among bishops, priests and deacons, showing that in the early Church, these three offices "Let's check out 1 Corinthians 12:28: 'And already existed (as they do in the Catholic God indeed hath set some in the church: first Church today). Bishops (episcopoi): "If a man desire the office of a bishop he desireth a good work." (1 Timothy 3:1)

Priests (presbyteroi): "Let the priests that rule well be esteemed worthy of double honor: especially they who labor in the word and doctrine." (1 Timothy 5:17)

Deacons (deakonoi): "Deacons in like manner: chaste, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre: holding the mys-

"By the fact that three distinct groups of ministers described by these three distinct terms are found within one letter by one author, we know that the author is making a true distinction between three types of ministers that existed in the **nswer:** "I'll bet you can't guess where early Church.
