**Apologetics Corner** Defending our Faith with the Truth Bv Father Dennis M. Gordon, FSSP

## **Good Works: A Sign of Salvation or Meritorious toward Salvation?**

**-** part of your salvation, but good works faith has to be manifested by our works. will just follow your justification – they are a sign of "In Galatians St. Paul says, <u>Galatians 5:6</u> where St. your having been saved. Isn't that what Paul taught?"

works are a *sign* of being saved, and you may be surprised to know what he *did* say about works. But we have to distinguish between simply works (good deeds) and works of the law. Now, if we don't understand our terms correctly, we'll get what he is saying wrong.

"So first, a little review of terms:

"**Justification** is the moment that a man is *moved* tion with fear and trembling for it is *God* who worfrom a state of sin to a state of friendship (state of grace) with God. This first happened for us at Baptism. If we have been justified (placed into a state of grace) then we *are* saved unless we lose that state by a new, mortal sin.

**"Faith** (in Greek, pisiV - *pistis*) is a supernatural vir- *faith did co-operate with his works*; and by tue by which one believes all that God has revealed. works faith was made perfect? Do you see that Like in English, it also has the connotation of fidelity, **by works a man is justified**; and **not by faith** as when one keeps faith with someone, so faith is ongoing – it can't be just one act in the past, and faith can be lost.

"Works of the Law (in Greek, ergwn nomou - er- can indeed be meritorious toward salvation once we *gon nomou*) is a technical term which refers to the are justified. So, works are not a *sign* of our having ritual observances of the Old Law, often in reference been saved – they are not a putting of the cart in to circumcision.

"What St. Paul says in reference to justification and salvation being independent of works of the law, he always said in context of the discussion of the necessity of the OLD Law. 'The law' that he speaks of is, to his Jewish-Christian audience's ears, would of course be a reference to the OLD law - the Jewish law and covenant.

"The context shows that St. Paul's words on this issue were not a denying that good deeds have a bearing on our salvation, but specifically a denying that *works of the law* – the *old* law, have any bearing

**uestion**: "You Catholics seem to put the cart anymore on salvation. We are justified by grace before the horse. You say that works are through faith, and in fact Scripture is clear that our

Paul says, 'For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumci**nswer**: "Actually St. Paul *didn't* say that **sion: but faith that worketh by charity.**"

> "St. Paul even says that our works have this influence on our salvation. In Romans St. Paul says that God 'will render to every man according to his *works*, to them indeed who, according to *patience* in good work, seek glory and honor and incorruption, eternal life.' (Romans 2:6-10)

> "Then in Philippians he says, 'Work out your salvaketh in you. (Philippians 2:12-13).

> "Finally, we have the words of the Apostle St. James, the bishop of Jerusalem, who said in the Bible, 'Was not Abraham our father justified by works, offering up Isaac his son upon the altar? Do you see that only?

> "It is true that we cannot earn the grace of being put *into* a state of justification (salvation); but our works front of the horse – but rather works are a *necessary* expression of that faith that works through charity whereby we are saved!"
