## **For your Convenience**

At the entrance of both doors to the church you will find for your use, **red booklets** containing the **Liturgy** as found in the Missal of 1962. The Mass is written in both English and Latin for you to follow along.

Also at the entrances, are **chapel veils** for ladies to cover their heads, a sign of respect for Our Lord, while in church.

**Coffee and doughnuts** are served after Sunday morning Masses downstairs in the parish hall. Please join us!

### **FAQ**

How is Communion Received? Communion is received on the tongue at the Communion rail while kneeling (if possible). There is no need to respond upon receiving the Host, as the priest will say "Amen". It is important that only Baptized Catholics, in the **State of Grace** (not aware of any grave sin not absolved by Confession), and have observed the Eucharistic fast, receive Holy Communion, as to receive otherwise is a sacrilege, and grave sin.

**Is There a Dress Code?** Attire is one of many ways in which we show outwardly our profound respect for the King of Kings. **Women** should dress modestly, preferable in a knee-length dress or skirt. Tight fitting, low cut, sleeveless and revealing clothing, are not appropriate attire. **Men** should wear a collared shirt and long pants, preferably with a tie and jacket while at Mass. T-shirts, shorts, and clothing with distracting logos are not appropriate clothing.

What Do I need to Know Before Making My Confession? As with all sacraments at St. Joan of Arc, Confession is administered in Latin. The priest sits behind a screen while the penitent kneels. On the credenza you will find pamphlets to assist you with an Examination of Conscience. In the Confessional you will find a "how to" list at the kneeler and the priest can also assist you in making your Confession.

How Do I Arrange for a Baptism, Marriage, and other Sacramental Need? Sacramentals can be arranged by contacting the church secretary, or by emailing or calling one of the priests directly.

How do I Make an Appointment with a Priest? To meet with a specific priest you can email or call him directly, or contact the church secretary to arrange a meeting. New comers are encouraged to do so. When calling the church you will hear a menu which includes the voicemail for each priest.

Where will the New Church be Located? The new church property is located at 4772 E. Poleline, Post Falls, ID 83854. It is anticipated that St. Joan of Arc will relocate there by the end of 2019.

**How do I Register with the Parish?** On the credenza you will find Registration Forms which, once completed, should be placed into the white drop box next to the church office or handed to one of the Ushers.
