# The "Son of Man" is God!

"First, Our Lord waited to state clearly that He is God (in front of the high priest Caifas, during Our Lord's trial) because otherwise (1) if He had said 'I am the King', the *Romans* would have immediately killed Him for sedition, and (2) if He had said 'I am God', the *Jews* would have immediately killed him for 'blasphemy'. He waited until He was ready to die for our sins, and then revealed that He was God openly: He then immediately proved it by rising from the dead, after He was executed.

"So how does the expression 'Son of Man' fit in? Our Lord used the expression 'the Son of Man' to describe Himself, among other places, in Mark **2:10-12**, when He said, 'But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (he saith to the sick of the palsy,) I say to thee: Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house. And immedi-

"The expression 'Son of Man' as a special title was used in **Daniel** 7:13-14, where we read, 'I beheld therefore in the vision of the night, and lo, one like **the son of man** came with the clouds of heaven, and he came even to the Ancient of days: and they presented him before him. And he gave him power, and glory, and a kingdom: and all peoples, tribes and tongues shall serve him: his power is an everlasting power that shall not be taken away: and his kingdom that shall not be destroyed.' Now the 'son of man' in Daniel's vision certainly seems heavenly and divine, and it implies a divine being who takes

> "So this title, Son of Man, in the context, is referring to God. Our Lord, by using this title for Himself, is stating that He is God fairly openly, at least for those who know what that title means in Sacred Scripture. In the context of Mark 2:10-12, Our Lord even shows that He is God by performing a miracle specifically to prove it: 'that you may know that the Son of Man has power on earth to forgive sins...'.


