

"In the ancient Biblical book of Job we can see that putting on ashes is a very ancient practice that accompanied prayer, in **Job 16:16, 18** - 'I have sowed sackcloth upon my skin, and have covered my **flesh with ashes...** These things have I suffered without the iniquity of my hand, when I offered pure prayers to God.'

"We also find the custom of ashes being put on the head, and fasting, in the Book of Maccabees. Now, Maccabees is *not* in a Protestant bible, but it *is* found in the Greek Scriptures, which were in use in Our




