These names and dates will be recorded into a registry book, and on the third Saturday of each month, one of our parish priests will offer the 9:30 AM Mass for these departed souls.

- Daily, pray for the repose of the holy souls in Purgatory. There are many beautiful prayers for the holy souls, but your prayer can be as simple as you like.
- Annually, have one Mass offered for the Purgatorial Society of St. Joan of Arc, with the usual stipend included.

There is no sign up for members. You become a member by fulfilling the requirements.


