"Let's see *where* that is in the Sacred Scriptures:

"In Ezechiel 36:25-27, the Jewish prophet Ezechiel prophesied the following:

'I will **pour upon you clean water**, and you shall be cleansed from all your filthiness, and I will cleanse you from all your idols.

'And I will give you a new heart, and **put a new** to pass **in that day...**' **spirit within you**: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and will give you a heart of flesh.

'And **I will put <u>my</u> spirit** in the midst of you: and I will cause you to walk in my commandments, and to keep my judgments, and do them.'

Ezechiel also shows the key elements and effects of spirit within you...'. And the 'I' Who is speaking here Baptism which would be given to the people: pouring is 'the Lord... the Lord of hosts'! > Behold I will make Jerusalem a lintel of surfeiting to all the people round about: and Juda also shall be in the siege against Jerusalem. And it shall come


♦ Mass: \$10
