

## Faith, Good Works, or Both?

Answer: "To understand St. Paul's thought on this issue we first have to understand his terms Justification, Faith and Works of the Law. These three terms are key to understand before having any discussion on this topic.

"Faith (pisiV - pistis) is a supernatural virtue by which one believes all that God has revealed. Like in English, it also has the connotation of fidelity, as when one keeps faith with someone, can be lost.

"Works of the Law (in Greek, ergwn nomou - ergon nomou) is a technical term which mainly refers to the ritual observances of circumcision of the Old Law.

the ritual observances of circumcision in the Old Law, and not cording to patience in good work, seek glory and honor just 'good deeds'? Three solid reasons: (1) the original Greek term itself, (2) how St. Paul uses the term in the context, and (3) how St. Paul speaks of simply works (good deeds) elsewhere. In the Greek Scriptures, which were used in St. Paul's time (the Septuagint), the word law is rendered as (nomoV nomos). This term 'law' (nomos) is used by Our Lord Himself to refer directly to circumcision.

"In John 7:22 Our Lord said, "A man receives circumcision on the sabbath day that the **law** (nomoV - nomos) of Moses be not broken". In fact, in the Greek Old Testament, this word 'law' (nomos) in the Hebrew is actually the word 'torah'. So when St. Paul uses the term 'works of the law', it would be accurate to understand that as 'works of the torah'; the ritual observance of circumcision in the Old Law.

Question: "Didn't St. Paul say that we are saved by faith, apart faith, apart from the works of the law, but we know this means keeping faith in Christ, 'separate from the works of the **torah**. In context, St. Paul's point was that we don't need circumcision in addition to our faith.

"What does the New Testament say about works **good deeds?** In **James 2:14-24** we read these words: What shall it profit, my brethren, if a man say he hath "Justification is the moment that a man is moved from a state faith, but hath not works? Shall faith be able to save him?... So faith also, if it have not works, is dead in first happened for us at Baptism. If we have been justified itself. ... Was not Abraham our father justified by works, offering up Isaac his son upon the altar? Do you see that faith did co-operate with his works; and by works faith was made perfect? Do you see that by works a man is justified; and not by faith only?"

"Our works can't earn us the grace of justification - being placed into a state of grace. That is a free gift so faith is ongoing – it can't be just one act in the past, and faith from God. But once in a state of justification, our works can and do either keep us in that state or cause us to lose that gift of eternal life, so says St. Paul and Our Lord! St. Paul says, "Work out your salvation with fear and trembling for it is God who worketh in you." (Philippians 2:12-13). "Our Lord said the same in **Matthew 7:21-23**; 'Not every one that says to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven: but he that does the will of my Father in heaven.' ♦ Other Sacraments: no stipend applies


