First Mass: Thanks be to God! The **First Mass** at our new home (4772 E. Poleline Ave., Post Falls) will take place today, October 27th, the **Feast of Christ the King**, at noon. A procession will follow the Solemn High Mass and then a luncheon in the new parish hall. Please note that 5:00 PM Mass, and **all Masses** there after, will be said at the new church in Post Falls.

Mass Schedule for All Saints and All Souls: Mass times on the feast of **All Saints**, November 1st, *a Holyday of obligation*, will be at 6:30 AM, 12:15 PM and a **sung** Mass at 6:30 PM. On November 2nd, the **Commemoration of All Souls**, Mass will be at 6:30 AM, and a **sung** Mass at 9:30 AM. As is permitted, each priest will say three Masses on All Souls Day. The additional **private** Masses will be said directly after each scheduled Mass.

First Friday and Saturday Devotions: This Friday, **All Saints Day**, is also the First Friday of the month. All night Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament will take place *in the Perpetual Adoration Chapel* following the 6:30 AM Mass until 6:00 AM on Saturday. Please sign up on the credenza to spend one hour with Our Lord. First Saturday Devotions will **not** take place in November, due to the Mass schedule for the Commemoration of All Souls.

Is Coming To St Joan of Arc Eucharistic Adoration

Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration is when the Holy Eucharist is exposed in a monstrance on an altar, every hour of the day, and every day of the week. It is required that at least one adorer is to be scheduled at all times. Wherever the Eucharist is, Christ is present - Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, and therefore must <u>never</u> be left alone without an adorer when exposed.

Sign up to become a Division Leader

There are four Division Leaders each of whom is responsible for one of the four time divisions - 12am-6am, 6am-12pm, 12pm-6pm, 6pm-12am. They oversee and are responsible for the six Hour time zone. In addition, they give general assistance to the Head Coordinator.

Sign up to become an Hourly Captain

An Hourly Captain is a contact person who is responsible for the Adorers at the same hour of the day (ex., 2pm) every day throughout the entire week.

Sign up for your holy hour(s)

Please note: Late night and early hours are the most quiet, meditative, and intimate hours of the day. They are also, the most difficult to fill. Please consider these hours in your family discussion of your hourly choices.

Sign up to be on the substitute list

A substitute has the option of picking the hours of the day they are available to fill in when an adorer is unable to make their hour(s).
