The Sacrament of Baptism

Question: "Was the inauguration of the rite and of the unclean woman. we call 'Baptism' meant to be a **sign** to the Jews, that the one who made Baptism a part of the worship of the true God was indeed the Messiah, the Anointed Savior?"

"Notice that in predicting the bringing of Baptism, Ezechiel also shows the key elements and effects of Baptism which would be given to the people: pouring on of *water*, being *cleansed* (from all filthiness, i.e., all sin), and given a *new spirit* (the *Holy* Spirit – the Holy Ghost, Who begins to dwell in our soul at Baptism, as the Church teaches).

"Also, it was prophesied that the Messiah (the Anointed Savior) would bring this rite that we know as Baptism in the prophecy of Zachari**ah 13:1-2**. There we read the following:

'In that day there shall be **a fountain** open to true Savior." the house of David, and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem: for the washing of the sinner,

"This prophecy from Zachariah speaks of this happening 'in that day', and this is a reference to the 'day' when the Messiah would come. That 'day' would coincide with the time when Jerusalem would be placed under siege, as we

"So yes, it was predicted that the Messiah would bring Baptism; and we know from Ezechiel 36:25-27 that this Messiah is God *Himself!* For the prophecy says 'I will pour out clean water... I will put MY spirit within you...'. And the 'I' Who is speaking here is 'the Lord... the Lord of hosts'! (Ezechiel 36:23)

"For this reason, the Jews knew that the one who would bring Baptism to the religion of God would indeed be the Divine Messiah. The bringing of Baptism is a sign to the Jews of the
