

Seven Holy Brothers Martyrs, July 10th

THE **ILLUSTRIOUS** martyrdom of these saints has been justly celebrated by the holy fathers. It happened at Rome under the emperor Antoninus, that is, according to several ancient copies of the acts of Antoninus Pius. The seven brothers were the sons of St. Felicitas, a noble pious Christian widow Rome, who brought them up in the most perfect sentiments and

♦ Other Sacraments: no stipend applies


We ask that parishioners request no more than three Mass intentions per priest at one time.


