On the Killing of Idolaters in the Promised Land

nswer: "Here is the short answer to this question: many are not aware that God did not want the Israelites to go this route, and that it was due to Israel's progressively worse sinfulness that this last rekind of thing today.

"The original command was that Israel be 'a nation of priests'. Not just the Levites were to be priests, but every firstborn male. This we see in **Exodus 4:22** and **19:6** ('you shall be to me a priestly kingdom, and a holy naof the people, for a light of the Gentiles.'

"However, after the golden calf debacle, in which the Israelites themselves fell into idolatry like the pagan nations, the priesthood was limited to the male *Levites*, and God's command was not to enter into friendships and covenants with the pagans, lest the Israelites be tempted to leave off the worship of the true God:

"Exodus 34:12-15 'Beware thou never join in friendship with the inhabitants of that land, which may be thy ruin: But destroy their altars, break their statues, and cut down their groves: Adore not any strange god. The Lord his name is Jealous, he is a jealous God. Make no covenant with the men of those countries lest, when they have committed fornication with their gods, and have adored their idols, someone call thee to eat of the things sacrificed.'
