The Principle Virtues & the Offspring of the Vices

habits which that capital sin spawns. There are **ty**: known offspring of each capital sin. The presence of those offspring vices indicate the presence of the capital sin at their root. This can help us identify our predominant fault.

ENVY - The offspring vices of ENVY are Deceitfulness [opposing virtue – Brotherly Love]:

Hatred Delight in another's misfortune Detraction Sadness in another's prosperity Murmuring (complaining: *why can't I...*)

SLOTH – The offspring vices of SLOTH are [opposing virtue – <u>Diligence</u>]:

<u>Spite</u> – towards those w/spiritual goods Despair – because not following precepts Malice – despising spiritual goods Sluggishness concerning precepts of God Pusillanimity – faint-heartedness Absent mindedness concerning illicit things

LUST - The offspring vices of LUST are Swelling up of the mind [opposing virtue – *Chastity*]:

Blindness of mind Love of self Inconsideration Hatred of God Inconstancy of will Love of the present life Acting without thinking Fear or despair concerning the next life

Each capital sin (each vice) produces other COVETOUSNESS - The offspring vices of vices like offspring. The offspring are other bad **GREED** are **[opposing virtue –** <u>Liberali-</u>

> Treachery (betraval) Insensitivity toward others (lack of mercy) Fraud (deception) Violence Perjury **Restlessness**

GLUTTONY – The offspring vices of GLUTTONY are [opposing virtue - Temperance]:

<u>Inept joy</u> (regarding the appetite) <u>Uncleanness</u> (sins of impurity) Scurrility (actions – can't keep still) <u>Dullness of mind</u> regarding intellectual things Loquaciousness (excess in words)

ANGER – The offspring vices of ANGER are [opposing virtue – Meekness]:

Indignation (resentment; annovance) **Disordered** speech Fights Reviling or shaming others Blasphemy

PRIDE – The offspring vices of PRIDE **are:** *Every* other vice

Prudence is the virtue by which one applies right reason to action. The principal parts firmness of mind in the face of dangers and diffiof **prudence** are *memory*, *understanding*, do- culties. The *vices* opposed to these virtues are precipitation, negligence, inconstancy and thoughtlessness.

The Potential Parts of JUSTICE

to another what is due to him. The potential parts of justice are *religion*, *piety*, *rendering* honor due to another, gratitude, vindication, truthfulness, friendliness and liberality (generosity). Each of these parts of justice help one render something due to another, either to God, our parents, our country, or others.

The *vices opposed* to these virtues are *su*perstition, tempting God, sacrilege opposed to religion; dishonor, disobedience and neglect opposed to piety; *ingratitude* opposed to gratitude;

tolerance – that is, tolerating attacks on God and our neighbor.

Fortitude is the virtue by which one has a maanificence

Temperance is the virtue by which one withdraws from those sensible delights which seduce the will from obeying reason. The parts of temperance, which cover the sensible delights related to food, drink and other sensible pleasures, are: *abstinence*, *sobriety*, *chastity*, purity, virginity; continence, clemency, *meekness.* The *vices opposed* to these are gluttony, drunkenness, lust, impurity; inconti*nence*, *cruelty*, and *anger*. Under purity is the **Justice** is the virtue by which one renders virtue of *modesty*. Modesty can be divided into humility, studiousness, and modesty concerning exterior behavior and exterior dress. The vices opposed to modesty are pride, curiosity, immodesty in actions and immodesty in dress.
