Some will object that nearly every pharmaceutical (over-the-counter pain medicine, steroids, antibiotics, the list goes on) has been tested on HEK-293; and so (the argument goes) if we are going to avoid the Covid-19 vaccine, to be consistent, we should also then avoid all these *other* products: since that is impractical, it is just as impractical to avoid the Covid-19 vaccine. Let's take a look at that objection:

One example of a common drug in use today that was also tested on HEK-293 is acetaminophen. Acetaminophen – Tylenol (to use one example among many) - was first developed in 1955. out of sheep, an ordinance was made that the children and young people of the town should be chosen by lottery to feed the dragon.


