

APOLOGETICS CORNER

Defending our Faith with the Truth By Father Dennis M. Gordon, FSSP

The Holy Ghost & Jehovah Witnesses

Question: "Found out something interesting: a All-knowing: "No man knoweth the things that Jehovah's Witness told me that they, and others are like the Unitarians, don't believe that the Holy God." Ghost (or Holy Spirit) is *God*, but rather they be-

How do show them from the Bible that **the Holy** Ghost is a Person of the MONON One God?"

Answer: "Let's look at a couple of verses! First we'll show from the Bible that the Holy Ghost (or Holy Spirit) is a **Person**, not a force. Then we'll see how that Person is *Divine: He is* God, and being Divine, He is a Person of the **One** God.

"First, the Holy Ghost is a **Person**: Before we begin, what exactly is a 'person'? An ancient definition is: an individual substance of a

rational nature (Boethius, St. Thomas Aquinas). Now that we know that, **Acts 8:29** says of the Holy Spirit, "And the Spirit said to Philip: Go near and join thyself to this chariot." Acts 13:2 says, "The Holy Ghost said to them: Separate **me** Saul that is, a person, to form sentences? And don't the unity of this One God: "Teach ye all nations, bapterms "me" and "I" have to refer to a person?

"Second, the Holy Ghost is **God**: To prove He is God, we have to know some attributes of God. and eternal? Well, the Holy Ghost is all of these:

"Finally. the earliest Christians *call the Holy Ghost God!* Check out the words of St. Peter to Ananias in Acts 5:3-4: "why hath Satan tempted you to lie to the Holy **Ghost**? ...thou hast not lied to men, but to **God**."

Therefore, in our prayer, among all acts of love towards God, there is none more perfect than the taking delight in the infinite happiness God enjoys. This is certainly the continual exercise of the

O my God, make me worthy of this, through the merits of Jesus Christ.


