Apologetics Corner

Defending our Faith with the Truth By Father Dennis M. Gordon, FSSP

The Holy Name of God

Question: "I notice that the Jehovah's Witnesses and not the 'Jeh-' sound, as the Jehovah's Witnesses are big on pronouncing the Name of God in that pronounce it. particular way: '<u>Je-ho-vah</u>', and they use that Name often. However, Jews and traditional Catholics pronounce it differently than the Jehovah's Witnesses do, and Jews and traditional Catholics also follow the practice of <u>rarely saying that Name of God</u>. What is going on with all that?"

Answer: "Good question; and there is a good answer.

Name of God as He gave it to Moses in Exodus, Jews and traditional Catholics follow the most likely pronunciation, pronouncing it 'Yahweh', and not 'Jehovah', since Je-ho-vah is actually a fabricated pronunciation. Jews and traditional Catholics also follow the Biblical custom (based on Leviticus 19:12 and Ecclesiasticus [Sirach] 23:10) of rarely using that Holy Name, out of great reverence for

"Here is the long answer: In Exodus 3:14, God told Moses His Name, giving it as) הוה (YHWH, also called the tetragrammaton), which means, "I AM" (God is HE WHO IS the only One Who exists by His very Nature). In Hebrew writing, there

were originally no vowels written in; only consonants. The knowledge of which vowel sounds were supposed to be used in a word, then, was learned by tradition.

"The pronunciation of the Holy Name of הוה YHWH as 'Yahweh' is the most likely one, though it became very rare to speak the Holy Name, so the correct sound is not quite historically clear. However, remnants of that likely pronunciation can still be seen in much *more* commonly used names that had the 'Yah-' sound in the name, like 'Isa**iah**' (which means <u>God</u> is salvation), 'Jerem<u>iah</u>' (which means God will exalt), 'Zachariah' (which means God remembers), and many others; all of which names end with the '-iah' or '-yah' sound that was the part of the name that referred to 'God' (Yahweh). This is one of the ways we can know that YHWH was most likely pronounced beginning with the 'Yah-' sound, treatment of the Holy Name of God."

'Also, Je-ho-vah is actually a fabricated pronunciation. Out of reverence for the Holy Name. the Jews would rarely pronounce it, and in fact they would replace it with אדני (Adonai, which means 'Lord'). Much later on, after the vowel 'pointing' system was developed between 600-1000 A.D., someone came up with the idea of taking the vowels of Adonai (Lord, a completely different word) and in-"Here is the short answer: In the use of the serting those vowels (A, o, a) into the word) יהוה

YHWH). But when 'A' is next to the Hebrew letter *yod* ('or Y), it changes the 'A' sound to an 'e' sound. [In case you want to be more precise; the hataf patah ('a' sound) changes to a sheva ('e' sound).] As a result, the vowels A, o, a from Adonai that they inserted in between the consonants) יהוה YHWH) became '**e**, o, a'. This gives Yehowah or, as the Jehovah's Witnesses pronounce it, *Je-ho-vah*.

"As you can see, and as stated earlier, it is a completely fabricated vowel/consonant combination: someone added the vowels of another word entirely to the consonants of a completely dif-

ferent word. Insisting that it be pronounced Jehovah is insisting on a non-historical invention.

"So why do Jews and Catholics rarely pronounce the name of 717YHWH? Jehovah's Witnesses say that this must be because we do not want this Holy Name to be glorified. This couldn't be further from the truth. We rarely pronounce this Holy Name because Leviticus 19:12 says, 'Thou shalt not profane the name of the Lord thy God'; and Ecclesiasticus [Sirach] 23:10 says, 'Let not the naming of God be usual in thy mouth.' Therefore, so as not to profane the Name of God as Sacred Scripture says. the Jews (and Catholics after them) rarely pronounced the name of Yahweh.

"In all this, I think we can see the importance of a living tradition, to pass on what is true, and not fall into error, and to keep the tradition of a reverential

We ask that parishioners request no more than three Mass intentions per priest at one time.


