gets so corrupted that it is very amusing.)

"The idea that the Gospel stories must have been of process. 'corrupted' or wildly changed over time before they were written down, so as to be inaccurate exaggerations, rests upon a couple of key suppositions which are simply (and provably) historically false.

'telephone game' comparison is that the persons *writ*- thew and John, were indeed eyewitnesses – these ing down the Gospels were originally anonymous; were two of the original twelve apostles that were chothat they were not composed by Saints Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

"The second false supposition behind the comparison is that the Gospel writers were not eyewitnesses, or were so grossly distant from the eyewitnesses that what they wrote down cannot be trusted. These two false suppositions are necessary to the 'telephone game' analogy, since the analogy rests upon the belief that the persons *writing* the original Gospels down *did not* have an evewitness connection how the Gospels were composed is just **not at all** to the actual Gospel events.

'But each of these suppositions is absolutely *false*, based upon *all* the historical evidence that is in existence.

"Addressing the second supposition: Since all the *historical* evidence of the earliest Gospels says that Ss. Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, wrote them, how can it be true is it that the writers didn't have **"The first false supposition** behind that eyewitness testimony? Two of the writers, Ss. Matsen by Our Lord. Of the other two, St. Mark was St. Peter's missionary companion, and St. Luke was St. Paul's missionary companion. St. Luke states in his Gospel that he has written what **eyewitnesses** have told him. Both of these Gospel writers are mentioned in the New Testament itself as important very early Christians therefore they do have a close connection to the actual events.

"Therefore, the 'telephone game' as an analogy for historically accurate, as the historical *evidence* shows, and these Gospels were composed by either evewitnesses themselves or by those who knew and were very close companions with eyewitnesses. EMBER DAYS

Tradtional days of fasting & penance

The term *Ember days* refers to a set of three especially in abstinence and prayer. Spaced evenly throughout days the year at the beginning of each of the four 'the fasts of the four seasons.

The purpose of their introduction was to thank God for the gifts of nature; to mark the start of a new

connection with ecclesiastical days within the same week (Wednesday, Friday ordinations, they eventually lost their connection and Saturday) which are set apart for fasting, to agriculture and came to be regarded solely as of penitence and prayer.

seasons, these Ember days were known in Latin as On Ember Wednesdays and Saturdays, extra the quatuor anni tempora – 'the four seasons of readings are added to the Mass. The Ember davs were definitively arranged and prescribed for the entire Church by Pope Gregory VII (1073-1085) as the Wednesday. Friday, and Saturday after the following feasts:

The third Sunday of Advent

For the average Catholic, living in a primarily agrarian world, sanctifying the different seasons of the year, upon which depended his sustenance, was an important part of life. In June were prayers for a bountiful harvest; in September for a rich vintage; in December and March for good seed.

The seasonal Ember days originated at Rome, and from there spread to the rest of the Church. But as they came to be associated with great feasts,

The first Sunday of Lent; Pentecost Sunday;

The third Sunday of September (after the Exaltation of the Holy Cross)

Fasting and penance used to be mandatatory on all Precious Blood; olives harvested in and, if possible, Holy Mass. The faithful may
