'Spiritual not Religious'

the cliché that 'I am spiritual, but not religious'?"

Answer: "I would first answer by asking the person, What do those two words mean; spiritual and religious?'

"If the person doesn't really have an answer (people who use that cliché often won't have a very clear notion of what those two things really are) you might fill in the awkward silence by saying, 'Well, when a person says that he is *spiritual*, he is really acknowledging that he has a spiritual component; that he is made up of body and soul, isn't he?

"Well, what is a spirit? First, a soul is simply a life principle; and a **spirit** is a life principle <u>as it inheres in</u> a **rational** being. So, to say that one is spiritual is really just an acknowledgment that one has a rational life *principle*. The *implication* that one is trying to convey when one says 'I am spiritual' is that one has an immortal aspect to one's being; an acknowledgment that one is aware that his rational soul is different than, for example, an animal's life principle (an animal only has a sen*sitive* soul, which is not rational and not immortal).

'However, how do we know what things will actually take care of the uniquely human and immortal aspect of the human soul? Where do we get the information as to how the human soul is to take care of itself insofar as it

Question: "What do you tell someone who repeats is spiritual? The part about being spiritual (the soul's ability to know and to freely will, which animal souls don't have) is that part of the soul that it has in common with God, who knows and wills all things, so God has to be the one who tells us what actions will sustain that 'side' of our soul.

> "What does being 'not religious' mean? Well, religion comes from a Latin word re-ligere, which means to re-bind or reconnect. Religion is how to reconnect to God. A good religion will reconnect one with God, on level that is above the senses; an insufficient religion won't reconnect one with God. To reconnect one with God, who is supernatural, isn't it necessary that it take a supernatural means (a supernatural religion), that is, a religion that must be given by God Himself?

> "However, even more precisely, **religion** is defined as the virtue by which one renders to God the worship that is due to Him. How do I know which kind of worship is due to God? God would have to tell us which kind of worship is appropriate. So, if one hasn't done the investigation into what God wants given to Him in worship, then I can't say that I am giving God the worship that is due to Him. What if a person's investigation Him.'

"**Ultimately**, the person who says that 'I am spiritual, Him, nor is he doing anything that will successfully reconnect (religere) him with God.

We ask that parishioners request no more than three Mass intentions per priest at one time.


