**From the FSSP:** The Apostolic Nuncio of the United States has sent an urgent communique to the nation's Bishops, informing them that the Holy Father is inviting each bishop to join him in an Act of Consecration of Russia & Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the Feast of the Annunciation, Friday, March 25<sup>th</sup>. The consecration will take place at 5:00 PM Rome time. Pope Francis is also sending a Cardinal to represent him & lead the consecration in Fatima, Portugal. While the scourge of war wages on this earth, we know it is not unconnected to a larger, cosmic battle between good & evil. We encourage all the friends of the FSSP to unite your prayers & sacrifices to this intention, that the consecration be made according to God's holy will & draw down immense graces for Russia, Ukraine, and the entire world. We also remind you of Our Lady of Fatima's request to do penance, to pray the Rosary, and to make the Five First Saturdays:

**In Our Diocese:** Bishop Peter Christensen will join with other Bishops & Pope Francis on Friday, March 25, in a consecration of Russia & Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. As the diocese pointed out, the Bishop will make the Consecration "very close to that exact time" as the Pope is making the same Consecration in Rome. The consecration will also be prayed at **St. Joan of Arc at 9 am.** All are welcome.

**Noisy children during Holy Mass:** Out of kindness and courtesy of others, including the priest offering the Mass, please take noisy children out of Mass. It is hard for the elderly and the priests to focus when children are being noisy. As a reminder, we have the nursing mother's room available during all Masses, as well as the parish hall if children get noisy. It will not adversely affect their faith to require children to be quiet at Mass. St. Therese, the Little Flower, wrote in her memoirs that she did not attend Holy Mass until she was older, and would ask her sisters about the sermon when they returned: she was old enough to ask this yet her saintly parents chose to have her stay home, not wanting to disrupt the Mass. Thank you.
