APOLOGETICS CORNER

Defending our Faith with the Truth

Adoration

Question: “Why do Eucharistic Adoration?”

Answer: “Well, if someone told you, ‘Guess what! Our Blessed Lord is appearing at this moment right here in Post Falls!’ wouldn’t you come to where He was to see Him?”

“St. Augustine says that not only do we *not* sin by going to adore Our Lord in His Eucharistic Presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament, but we *do* sin by *not* adoring Him there.

“Our Lord identified Himself with the Temple itself in **John 2:19-20**, and since to the Jews the Temple was nothing other than the place of God’s

dwelling on earth, by identifying Himself with the Temple He is saying that, ‘From now on, the place of God’s dwelling on earth is found

where My Body is found.’ But Our Lord’s Sacred Body is actually what the Blessed Sacrament really and truly is, so the Blessed Sacrament is indeed how God dwells on this earth since the institution of the New Covenant.

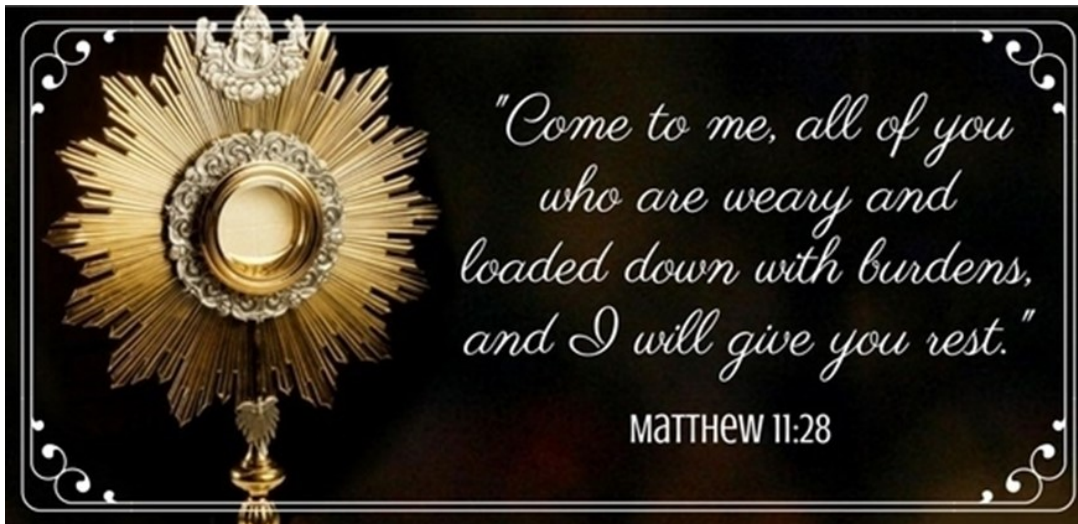
“Our Lord is just as present in the Blessed Sacrament, the Sacred Host, as He is in heaven. So why not go to spend time with Him where He is, then?

“It takes faith to see God present there when the appearances just look like bread. Eucharistic Adoration then also will increase our faith, for when we treat the Blessed Sacrament exactly as though He were appearing in His presence as He was in the Holy Land, or as He appeared transfigured in glory on Mount Tabor, we make a pro-

found act of faith, and each act of faith that draws us deep than we have been drawn before causes an increase in our faith.

“Our Lord, and the Old Testament priest Melchisedech who was a *type* (a foreshadow) of Our Lord, ‘*was heard for his reverence*’ (**Hebrews 5:7**). So we also, if we want to be heard by God, we also need to be reverent. This is what Eucharistic Adoration does: it gives God some of the reverence due to Him. Our reverent presence at Adoration makes up for the irreverence of many others.

“Doesn’t Our Lord deserve the consolation of



our physical presence for all the sacrileges, outrages and indifference with which He Himself is offended? Doesn’t His descent from Heaven to

Earth to be with us in justice require a response of our presence with Him where He has humbled Himself to make Himself physically present among us?

“So come to the dwelling place of God on earth: come to His dwelling in Post Falls, Idaho – in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the altar, in Eucharistic Adoration!

“You will become holy. You will receive inner joy. You will recover the peace you need to continue on in life. And you will give Him consolation.”

Spiritual Reading for Lent

Great means of sanctification come from spiritual reading, especially reading *Sacred Scripture*, the *masters of the interior life* (St. John of the Cross, St. Teresa of Avila, St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Alphonsus Liguori, St. Alphonsus Rodriguez, Tauler, etc.), and the *lives of the Saints*. Some works are **theological** (teaching doctrine), some are **spiritual** (describing the interior life), and others are **devotional** (motivation to grow in the spiritual life). The **Gospels** take priority, as they contain for us special graces that incline us more to the imitate the virtues of Christ. After this comes the Acts of the Apostles (the “Lives of the Original Saints”), and the Epistles.

The **Epistles and Old Testament** can be used to learn about the following:

The Person and work of Christ:
Colossians 1

The splendor of the life of the Church: Ephesians 1-3

Justification: Romans 1-11

Priesthood of Christ: Hebrews 1-9

Duties of Christians regarding the Church: 1 Peter 4

Prayer: The Psalms
Interior Souls: The

works of the prophets; Books of Wisdom

Practical guidance to learn wisdom: Proverbs, Ecclesiasticus

The **works of the Saints** and **spiritual classics** are most helpful:

St. Augustine: Confessions (for conversion)

St. Gregory the Great: Exposition on the Book of Job

Cassian: Conferences on the Desert Fathers

Richard of St. Victor: Benjamin Minor and Benjamin Major; Exposition on the Song of Songs (on the interior life)

Blessed Hugh of St. Cher: On the Spiritual Life

St. Albert the Great: Commentary on Sacred Scripture

St. Catherine of Siena: Dialogues

Thomas a Kempis: Imitation of Christ (to get motivated; not recommended for the scrupulous)

St. Alphonsus Liguori: Anything by him, esp. 12 Steps to Holiness; Victories of the Martyrs

Francisco de Osuna: Third Spiritual Alphabet

St. John of the Cross: Ascent of Mt. Carmel

St. Teresa of Avila: The Way of Perfection (for interior souls)

There are **more recent devotional books** which are very good:

Jesus Our Eucharistic Love: Fr. Stephano Manelli

The Book of Confidence: Fr. Laurent (for those struggling with confidence in God)

Searching for and Maintaining Peace: Fr. Philippe (to keep peace in the midst of difficulty)

Works of Fr. Faber: Various good devotional works

Works of Fr. Eugene Boylan:
Various good devotional works

For children, these books are very good:

We ask that parishioners request no more than three Mass intentions per priest at one time.

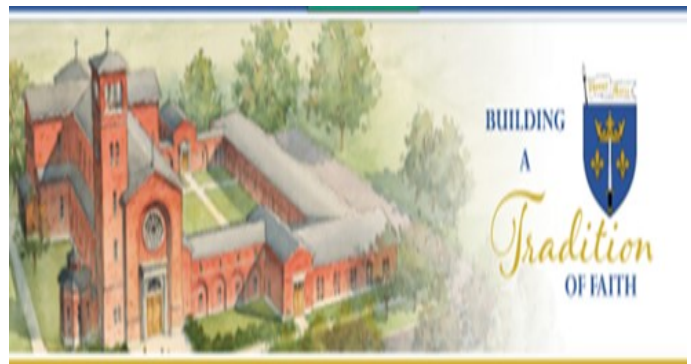
