APOLOGETICS CORNER

Defending our Faith with the Truth By Father Dennis M. Gordon, FSSP

The Holy Ghost and the Orthodox church

(sometimes called the Eastern Orthodox, Russian ther. Orthodox or Greek Orthodox), believes that the Holy Ghost only proceeds from the Father and does not proceed from the Son also. How do we know that the Roman Catholic belief that the Holy Ghost proceeds from the Father \overline{AND} the **Son** is correct?"

Answer: Scripture which show that the Holy Ghost proceeds Holy Ghost as a river of living water (or a 'river of

from the Father AND the Son, as the Catholic Church believes, and does *not* proceed from *only* the Father, as the Orthodox believe.

"Before we even start, what do we mean by 'proceeds from' the Father and the Son? When we say that the Holy Ghost *proceeds from* the Father and the Son (as we do in the Nicene Creed), we mean that both God the Father and God the Son are active agents in bringing forth ('producing', to use more loose language) the Holy Ghost. By *proceeding from* the Father and the Son, we are saying that the Holy Ghost originates from

both the Father and the Son. The Holy Ghost always existed along with the Father and the Son: the Holy Ghost has been proceeding from both God the Father and God the Son from all eternity.

starters: here we find these words of St. Paul, 'And' the Lamb of God, as well as from the Father. because you are sons, God hath send the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying: Abba, Father.' St. Paul calls the Holy Ghost the Spirit of His <u>Son</u>, because the Holy Ghost proceeds from the Son, as well as from the Father.
