Fr. Flick's Mass intentions: are private this week.

Traditional Reverences: (from Fr. Gordon) a slight bowing of one's head was customarily done when the crucifix passes during the entrance procession at Holy Mass. Although not forbidden, the slight head bow was traditionally not done when the priest passes by in procession or leaves the altar after Mass. When the priest passes by carrying the Blessed Sacrament, the custom is that all should kneel till the Blessed Sacrament has passed by.

Pro Life Rosary: The Pro Life Group of St. Joan of Arc will meet Saturday June 18 at noon in front of Planned Parenthood in Spokane (123 E. APOLOGETICS CORNER

Defending our Faith with the Truth

Bread and Wine

Question: “Why do Catholics use bread and wine as part of your worship service?”

Answer: “There’s an answer for that in the Bible, my friend! First let me ask *you* a question. Did you know that Our Lord Jesus Himself told us to do so the night before He died?”

“In **Luke 22:19** we read: ‘*And having taken the **chalice**, He gave thanks, and said: Take, and divide it among you... And taking **bread**, He gave thanks, and broke; and gave to them, saying: This is my body, which is given for you. Do this for a commemoration of me. In like manner the chalice also, after He had supped, saying: This is the chalice, the new testament in my blood, which shall be shed for you.*’ Did you know that this action, involving bread and a chalice of wine, was the **one thing** that Our Lord asked us to do in memory of Him, on the very night before He died for us?”

“But that’s not all. In **Numbers 28:13-14**, we hear the commandment of God that with “every lamb” offered there is to be offered “in sacrifice” an offering of flour (bread), and “libations of wine that are to be poured out for every victim.” Our Lord is the “lamb of God” (**John 1:29**), therefore to fulfill the law He would indeed have offered in *sacrifice* bread and wine along with Himself, the Lamb of God. However, the bread and wine are sacrificed, changed, when they are completely transformed to become His Body and Blood. How do we know the bread and wine change to become His actual Body and Blood? Because He said so! “This **IS** my Body... (**Luke 22:19**) This **IS** my Blood...” (**Matthew 26:28**, **Mark 14:24**), and

the Lord has said that ‘*whatsoever word I shall speak, it shall come to pass*’ (**Ezekiel 12:25**).

“Our Lord even explained what this ‘bread’ *actually* is in **John 6:52**: ‘*The bread that I will give **is** my flesh, for the life of the world.*’

“You may object that bread and wine were used in the *Old Testament*, but now we are in the *New Testament*. However the use of bread and wine in the worship of God in the *New Testament* is critical! By God’s command, bread and wine were offered together, and we know that the offering of wine is critical to the *New Testament* because according to St. Paul **and** Our Lord, the chalice of wine **IS** the *New Testament* in His Blood! ‘*This chalice **is** the new testament in my blood*’ (**1 Corinthians 11:25**). ‘*This is the chalice, the new testament in my blood*’ (**Luke 22:20**).

“According to the Bible, then, since Christ says that the chalice of wine which becomes ‘*My Blood*’ **is** ‘*the new testament in My Blood*’, you can’t have the new testament worship apart from offering the chalice of wine, which becomes His Blood! And because Christ is alive, where His Blood is, His Body is also, and so in the *New Testament* He gives His flesh along with His Blood; flesh which has the appearance of bread (the bread that I will give **is** my flesh...).

“This is why we worship with bread and wine, Our Lord changing them by His word into His actual Body and Blood for us in the *New Testament*!”



Feast of Corpus Christi

THE feast of Corpus Christi is celebrated in the Latin Church on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, in solemn commemoration the institution of the Holy Eucharist. Holy Thursday is the proper celebration of this event; however, this being in Holy Week, a season of sadness wherein the minds of the faithful are occupied which, after having extolled the love of Our Saviour as expressed in the Holy Eucharist, he ordered the annual celebration of Corpus Christi on the Thursday next after Trinity Sunday. Recently, in the United States and some other countries, the solemnity is held on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday.



with thoughts of the Lord's Passion, such that the joyful celebration proper to it is not able properly to be expressed; and moreover, so many other functions taking place on this day that the principal event is almost lost sight of, the introduction of a new feast was seen as being necessary.

The instrument in the hand of Divine Providence to bring this about was St. Juliana of Mont Cornillon, in Belgium. Born in 1193 and orphaned at an early age, she was educated by the Augustinian nuns of Mont Cornillon. Here she made her religious profession, and later became mother superior of the convent. From her early youth, Juliana had a great veneration for the Blessed Sacrament and always longed for a special feast in its honour. This desire is said to have been increased by a vision she had of the Church under the appearance of a full moon having one dark spot, signifying the absence of this solemnity. She made known her ideas first to Robert de Thorete, Bishop of Liège, who was favourably impressed. After many years, Urban IV published the Bull '*Transiturus*' (8 Sep. 1264), in

The Office for the feast of Corpus Christi was composed by St. Thomas Aquinas at the request of Pope Urban IV. One of the most beautiful in the Roman Breviary, this office has been admired even by non-Catholics for the richness of its hymns. From these various hymns, several stanzas have been taken which are regularly sung in honor of the Blessed Sacrament, even outside the feast day itself. Those most well-known are the *Panis Angelicus*, taken from the Matins Hymn *Sacris Solemnis*; the *O Salutaris Hostia* taken from the hymn for Lauds *Verbum Supernum Prodiens*; and the *Tantum Ergo*, taken from the Vespers hymn *Pange Lingua*.

The stanzas *O Salutaris* and *Tantum Ergo* are the official hymns for Exposition and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, respectively. Additionally, St. Thomas wrote the hymn *Adoro Te Devote*, a Eucharistic thanksgiving prayer, and the sequence *Lauda Sion Salvatorem*, sung at Holy Mass prior to the Gospel.
