Sacred Images; 'Sola Scriptura'

The Use of Sacred Images in Scripture Answering Sola Scriptura – the Bible

1. The Argument against using 'graven images'

1) "The 1st Commandment forbids them." a. Exodus 20:4

We ask that parishioners request no more than three Mass intentions per priest at one time.


