"We do need faith to please God. We can't really salvation; works done without God living in the soul by charity ('God is charity' - 1 John 4:8). But once one has faith, and the gift of charity in the soul (God in the soul), he has to keep that faith alive by charity-by keeping the commandments in the state of grace.

"This explains why in **James 2:26** we read: faith without works is dead."

The Real Presence

(St. Irenaeus)

The following is an excerpt from Adversus Haere- season, or as a grain of wheat falling into the earth ses (Against Heresies), by St. Irenaeus, written in and becoming decomposed, rises with manifold 175-185 A.D. It shows that the belief in the Real Presence—that Our Lord is truly present, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, as the Most Blessed Saclief in the Christian Church:

Against Heresies 5.2: "By His own blood he re-

deemed us, as also His apostle declares, In whom we have redemption through His blood, even the remission of sins. Colossians 1:14 And as we are His members, we are also nourished by means of the creation (and He Himself grants the creation to us, for He causes His sun to rise, and sends rain when He wills Matthew 5:45). He has acknowledged the cup (which is a part of the creation) as **His own blood**, from which He bedews our blood: and the bread (also a part of the creation) He has established as His own body, from which He gives increase to our bodies.

3. When, therefore, the mingled cup and the manufactured bread receives the Word of God, and the Eucharist of the blood

and the body of Christ is made, from which things the substance of our flesh is increased and supported, how can they affirm that the flesh is incapable of receiving the gift of God, which is life eternal, which [flesh] is nourished from the body and blood of the Lord, and is a member of Him?- even as the blessed Paul declares in his In this same letter, St. Ignatius calls the Christian Epistle to the Ephesians, that we are members of Church "the Catholic Church": His body, of His flesh, and of His bones. Ephesians 5:30 He does not speak these words of some spiritual and invisible man, for a spirit has not bones nor flesh; Luke 24:39 but [he refers to] that dispensation [by which the Lord became] an actual people] also be; even as, wherever Jesus Christ is, man, consisting of flesh, and nerves, and bones— there is the Catholic Church. that [flesh] which is nourished by the cup which is His blood, and receives increase from the **bread which is His body**. And just as a cutting from the vine planted in the ground fructifies in its

> This is an excerpt from Letter to the Smyrnaeans, by St. *Ignatius of Antioch, who died* It also shows the Catholic belief about the Holy Eucharist **is** the ancient Christian belief. This is the first Christian document to call the Sacrament of Our Lord's Body and Blood the "Eucharist"

In this paragraph, he is speaking of heretics:

Letter to the Smyrnaeans, 7: They [heretics] abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer, because they confess not **the** Eucharist to be the flesh of our Saviour Jesus Christ. which suffered for our sins, and which the Father, of His good-

ness, raised up again. Those, therefore, who speak against this gift of God, incur death in the midst of their disputes. But it were better for them to treat it with respect, that they also might rise again.

Letter to the Smyrnaeans, 8: Wherever the bishop shall appear, there let the multitude [of the
