Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary

Denton, Nebraska

In 1993, the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter established its international seminary for English-speaking candidates. The seminary was named for Our Lady of Guadalupe, in honor of her title as the Patroness of the Americas. The initial location was in the North American District headquarters building in Elmhurst, Pennsylvania, through the courtesy of the local Bishop.

and Paul, the crown jewel of the seminary, was completed and dedicated in 2010.

From an initial enrollment of a few young men, the seminary now includes nearly 90 seminarians, and is reaching full capacity.

The architecture of the seminary is of Romanesque style and is reminiscent of Catholic architecture from that period in history. The traditional basilica form of the chapel presents

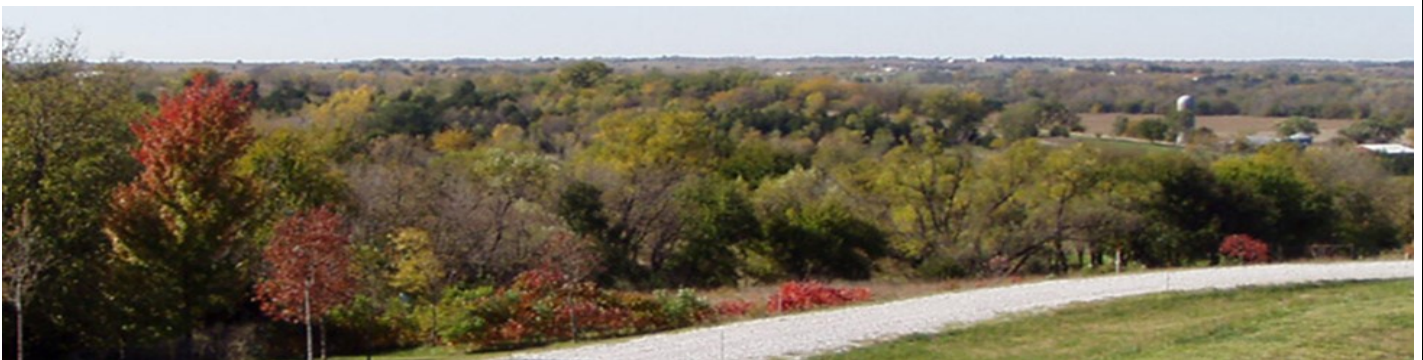


As the enrollment increased, the need for a new and permanent location resulted in the generous invitation of His Excellency, Fabian W. Bruskewitz, Bishop of Lincoln, to locate in the Lincoln Diocese.

In the fall of 1998, ground was broken for the new seminary, and construction began. The first of three phases was completed in time for classes to begin in the fall of 2000. A second dormitory wing was added in 2005. The Chapel of Ss. Peter

and Paul, the crown jewel of the seminary, was completed and dedicated in 2010.

In addition to the necessary features of a seminary, Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary has recreation rooms, a complete gym, soccer field, hiking trails and ponds on its 140 acre site. The rural setting is conducive to study, prayer and contemplation.



St. Peter's Seminary

Wigratzbad (Germany)

The International Seminary of St. Peter in Wigratzbad, Germany, was the first seminary founded by the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, its first house established canonically and the site of its General House. It is situated on the ancient frontier of Bavaria and Swabia, a short distance from Germany's borders with neighbouring Austria and Switzerland. It is less than twenty kilometers from the renowned island city of Lindau on Lake Constance at the foot of the Alps.

The little hamlet of Wigratzbad in the township of Opfenbach had already gained a name for itself as a pilgrimage centre decades before the arrival of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter. Pilgrims flocked here from the surrounding district as well as from other regions in Germany, Austria, Switzerland and France. Particular honour is paid here to the Mother of God under her title "Immaculate Conception, Mother of Victory". The pilgrimage site finds its origin in the extraordinary life of Miss Antonie Rädler, beginning in the 1930s and developing over the years into a centre of prayer and reparation to the Immaculate and Sacred Hearts. Antonie Rädler and the former director of the pilgrimage centre, Father Johannes Schmid of the Passionist Congregation, had discussed the idea of an international seminary in Wigratzbad many years before the Fraternity of St. Peter was founded.

After the foundation of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter in the fall of 1988, the founders began to seek a suitable site for a house of priestly formation. As early as August, 1988, Bishop Josef Stimpfle of Augsburg announced that he would accept a canonical establishment in Wigratzbad. In November, thirty-one seminarians commenced their studies. Father Josef Bisig became both the Superior General of the fledg-

ling institute and the rector of its new house of formation. From the beginning the studies were divided into two language groups, French and German. Seminarians from countries speaking other languages chose to study in one of the two groups.

Until the fall of 2000, under the rectorships of Frs. Bisig, Gouyaud, Baumann and du Fay, the seminary was housed in the pilgrimage centre. During these years the curriculum of studies was developed and many ecclesiastical dignitaries were welcomed, such as Cardinals Mayer, Ratzinger, Gagnon and Stickler, as well as a number of bishops and archbishops. In these years the problem of a shortage of space was growing, so that the Superior General and the Rector conceived a plan to construct a building on the neighbouring premises uniquely to serve the needs of the seminary.

At the beginning of the autumn term in 2000, and with the installation of its new rector, Fr. Bernward Deneke, the building was opened. It was solemnly blessed by Darío Cardinal Castrillón Hoyos on 2nd December 2000. At present the International Seminary of St. Peter, together with a separate building constructed by the diocese, houses over 100 young men from Germany, France, Austria, Switzerland, Denmark, Poland, Spain, Portugal, Brasil, Chile and Columbia who are preparing to become priests for the third millennium. The actual rector is Fr. Vincent Ribeton.

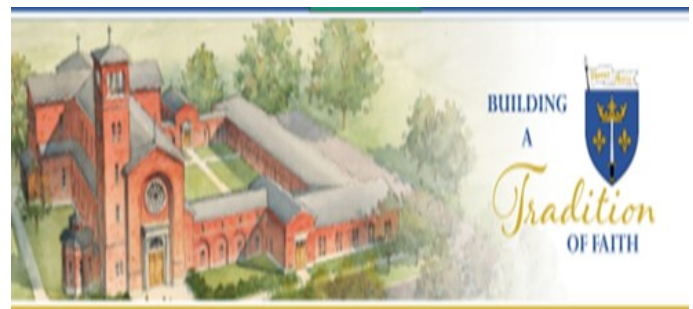
